

Traveling with your pet Internationally

Where to start

- Each country has a list of requirements which must be met in order for the pet to enter the country. These requirements can be found on the USDA Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service website: <https://www.aphis.usda.gov/aphis/pet-travel/take-pet-to-foreign-country>
- It is important to remember that some countries (such as those who are rabies free) can take several months to fulfill all of the requirements for travel. Keep this in mind when booking your flights, and making appointments with your veterinarian.

Basic Required Information

- For ALL Health Certificates issued
 - The expected date of Travel and arrival in the destination country
 - The address of residence in the United States and in the destination country where your pet will be staying
 - Current Vaccination Records
- For SOME Health Certificates
 - Microchip # and date of implantation
 - Parasitic treatments (flea/dewormer)
 - Laboratory Tests (Rabies Titer etc.)

Airline Requirements

- Several Airlines have their own set of requirements for your pet to travel in addition to the Health Certificate. Be sure to contact your airline and print out any forms needed before your appointment.
